VINEYARD

Old granitic soils with a high degree of decomposition and medium clay content

VITICULTURE

Vigno stands for Vignadores de Carignan and is an association of producers whose goal is to preserve and promote wines made from old Carignan vines that have been dry-farmed and bush-trained in the Maule Secano area.

WINEMAKING

Cold maceration (10°C) for 48 hours, fermentation takes place in concrete tanks at 24-28°C for 18 days using natural yeasts. This is then aged in oak for 12 months and further year in bottle before release.

TASTING NOTES

Deep coloured, extraction in tears, elegant ripe and concentrated nose, mocha and liquorice with fine dark berry fruit, fine veneer of elegant oak toast, grippy tannins and crunchy acidity. Long length.
